Fleet Week 2023 August 1-6





Ships from the US Coast Guard, US Navy and Royal Canadian Navy will be on the Seattle waterfront August 1-7 for Fleet Week 2023, cohosted by Navy League Seattle with Seafair and the Port of Seattle.

Pier 62 will the center of action on August 1 with the parade of ships entering Elliott Bay and a Coast Guard search and rescue demonstration, as well as music and displays.

The hub of Fleet Week activity shifts to **Terminal 46** August 2-6, featuring tours of US Navy and US Coast Guard ships, along with music, displays, and information booths.

There will also be public tours of US Coast Guard ships at **Pier 66** (August 2-3) and Royal Canadian Navy ships at **Pier 69** (August 2-6).



And of course, the Blue Angels will be in the skies over Seattle during the week!

There will be plenty of volunteer opportunities to help make the week a success. More to follow as plans come together!

Navy League Seattle Fleet Week Reception August 1

Our marquee event for Fleet Week will be the Navy League Seattle reception to welcome visiting and local sea service members to Seattle.



It will take place at Bell Harbor Conference Center the first evening of Fleet Week, after the visiting ships have paraded into Elliott Bay, and will feature recognition of outstanding service members.




Navy League Seattle members **Sanu Chacko** and **Heather Raiti** were part of the event recognizing servicemembers who call the Puget Sound home.
